




STUDY HABITS

Independent study is the preparation students are required to complete in preparation for lessons. Students should routinely:

- Review class content
- Check learning
- Write down questions you have for the next lesson

Revision takes place after the teaching is complete and if the independent study has been done. Examples of revision are:


- Create study notes e.g. mind maps or cue cards
- Practise exam questions and refer to mark schemes
- Identify gaps in learning and repeat



STUDY HABITS

Day-to-day lessons, notes/filing etc.

- Have a day-today working folder for recent classwork/homework
- Keep the bulk of your notes safe at home in a big lever arch folder
- Use dividers for subject/teacher/homework
- At the start/end of each topic, create a checklist to go in your folder to help you keep everything in order – this will make revision easier
- File your notes everyday
- Seek help early if unsure
- Be on time to lessons

Year 12

- Research university courses and apprenticeships.
- Decide if you will move out of home or not for higher education.
- Speak to friends and family about any of their experiences of university and other courses.
- Take part in extra curriculum activities through school or organised by yourself.
- Work out what grades their chosen courses will require and whether these course choices are appropriate for them.
- At the end of the academic year, begin to write personal statements and complete the UCAS online application form.
- Visit universities and visit UCAS open days.
