Our parents and carers



Facilities

Our school provides an outstanding environment for exceptional teaching. Learning spaces are light, airy, spacious and flexible.

The ICT infrastructure allows access to IT throughout the site and teaching rooms have soundfield systems to help students with a hearing impairment to participate in all aspects of school life. We have a well resourced library at the heart of the school.

The landscaped grounds include outside learning spaces such as an amphitheatre, science pond and allotment. Our dining hall meets a range of dietary and cultural requirements including vegetarian, halal and non halal menus.

We have the use of the adjoining leisure centre in the day, which in

addition to the main sports hall, includes a swimming pool, specialist dance studio and exercise suite. We have extensive playing fields which include two football pitches, and in summer a cricket pitch, crickets nets and athletics facilities to complement out Multiple Use Games Area.



Curriculum

Our ethos "opening the door to success" and four core values embedded in our name DWHS (determination, wisdom, honesty, and service) together drive our intent and vision for curriculum provision and delivery.

We have a diverse curriculum which ensures that all our students receive a high-quality learning experience. In confirming our commitment to the broad and balanced principles of our curriculum we celebrate our expertise in mathematics and computing to drive excellence and innovation.

The school's curriculum enables our students to become:

- confident, resilient individuals, who aspire to excellence and make outstanding progress leading to high quality qualifications.
- responsible citizens who make a positive contribution to society including their local community and the wider international world in which they exist thereby embedding our core values of respect and co-operation.

Our curriculum at KS3 is well balanced and we offer a wide choice of subjects at KS4 and KS5. At the heart of all our work is the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of our young people.

Students participate in a weekly assembly and a thought for the week, celebrating world religions and exploring philosophical concepts. Citizenship, Personal, Social, Health Education (CPSHE) including Sex and Relationship

Education (SRE) are, as with all subjects, taught with sensitivity.

Our ambitious curriculum enables students to achieving outstanding outcomes. Our Progress 8 score for 2022 was 0.89.

Further to this 83% of students achieved passes in both English and maths, with 63% achieving strong passes in both. All of these figures are significantly above the national averages.









Supporting our students

Dormers Wells High School is an inclusive school and our commitment to the individual needs of all students is at the core of our work.

There is personalised curriculum support for students with special needs and for those learning English as an additional language. The school is fully accessible for people with disabilities, including two lifts to ensure easy access. The Hearing

Impaired Provision is supported by excellent acoustics and sound systems to provide an environment where our hearing impaired students can thrive.

Our high achieving students are stretched by a programme that

focuses on academic challenge in the classroom. This is supported by a wide range of extra-curricular activities, such as public speaking, master classes, debating, mentoring, and visits to universities and workplaces.



Staff training

Our staff are our prime asset and we are fortunate to have a very highly qualified and stable staff who are keen to develop their teaching and subject knowledge to meet the needs to our students.

We are committed to lifelong learning and professional development is a priority.

Many of our teaching staff are engaged in masters degree study. A number of our middle and senior leaders are following National College of School Leadership programmes.

Enrichment

School trips and educational visits are a powerful, positive teaching tool that enhance the social, personal and emotional development of all students and teachers.

At Dormers Wells High School, we believe learning opportunities outside the classroom enhance learning inside the classroom. We therefore offer a diverse range of enrichment activities and school trips to each year group which include:

The Arts

We offer a wide range of opportunities for students to develop their skills and knowledge of drama outside of the classroom.

Throughout the year there are several opportunities for students to become involved in performances such as the Whole School Production in the Summer Term and a smaller scale workshop performance early in the Spring Term. The most recent school production was 'Annie'.

In recent years we have collaborated with various West End theatres to enhance our students understanding and appreciation of live theatre.

Our students also had the opportunity to participate in a dance project with the English National Ballet and this involved inschool dance workshops, a student showcase performance and a theatre trip to Sadler's Wells.

Music in Secondary Schools Trust programme

Dormers Wells High School is proud to be one of only twentyfive schools nationally that is part of the Music in Secondary Schools Trust (MiSST) programme. This means that all students receive a free classical musical instrument from the school, and will learn how to play this instrument from Year 7. The programme enables students to engage with music, in order to promote personal, social, intellectual and cultural development. Research has shown the positive impact that learning an instrument can have on raising academic outcomes. Throughout all topics, an emphasis on perseverance, resilience and self-evaluation will help students to develop as successful learners. In addition to Music lessons, students



have the opportunity to further develop their musical talent through extra-curricular peripatetic lessons. There are also opportunities for students to audition for our school orchestra, perform at celebration

assemblies, awards evening and open evenings amongst others.

House System

All students and staff at Dormers Wells High School are allocated to one of six Houses.

The House System promotes the qualities we want our students to aspire towards and achieve. It challenges them to get involved with a number of school events and competitions building resilience, integrity and confidence. Membership to a House fosters a sense of belonging and identity.

The House System also promotes cohesion across different Year

groups with older students leading, supporting and inspiring younger ones. Inspiration from the Global Institute for Student Aspiration (GISA) was sought which identifies eight conditions which affect aspiration:













CROSS CURRICULAR ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

All students take part in a Cross-curricular Enrichment Programme every summer term where they can sign up to a 'package' of events and opportunities or trips for that week. It is an exciting week in school that provides students with new opportunities and enriches students' cultural capital.

Sixth form

We have a thriving sixth form offering a wide range of courses which reflects our inclusive ethos. We strive for our students to achieve excellence at all levels of study. The vast majority of our level three sixth form students progress to the university of their choice.



First class guidance is offered to students at KS4 to assist them in making the right academic decision. A higher than average proportion of students progress into our sixth form. Once in the sixth form the support and guidance continues to be strong with preparation for application to university being an ongoing priority. This is facilitated by personal tutoring and through a range of specific programmes to support student applications to top universities including, Oxford, Cambridge and Harvard. Students are also successful in gaining bursaries.

Our sixth form students are fully involved in the life of the school as student leaders, mentors, academic tutors and reading buddies. They are outstanding role models for other students in the school and are actively involved in many community projects.

In addition to the wide ranging curriculum there are extensive extracurricular activities and trips including overseas educational visits.

Pastoral care

Form Tutors and Year Leaders work in partnership with parents and carers to help our students be happy and successful learners with enhanced opportunities in later life as a result of learning with us.

Student progress is monitored closely and tracked continuously. Regular progress checks, parents' evenings and student focus events allow for an effective dialogue between the school and parents and carers.

Additional guidance for students is provided through our inclusion team which includes an experienced group of learning mentors, counsellor, cognitive behaviour therapist and other professional agency support.

Our detailed pastoral curriculum gives all students a consistent and fulfilling start to the day, including a weekly assembly, a structured literacy programme, lessons on character values, careers and options guidance and revision support.

For students joining our school there is a detailed induction programme to help make the transition a positive and happy experience. For Year 6 students at the end of

the summer term our staff will visit them in their primary schools. Year 6 will be invited in to our school for a day in the summer term and parents and carers are invited to a personal meeting with senior staff.

Home learning

The school believes home learning (homework) is very important. The amount of home learning increases steadily from Year 7 to Year 13 and students are supported to develop organisational skills and independence. Independent learning is supported through our Managed Learning Environment (MLE): DWHS Learning Resources. Here, parents and students can access centralised curriculum resources, and supplementary resources can be accessed through Teams. A range of other websites (for example GCSEPod and Educake) are used to support learning, and can be used by students to further their independent practice and revision.

Rewards

Rewards play an integral part of school life at Dormers Wells High School. We look for every opportunity to celebrate our students' successes and we acknowledge this through our house system, rewards trips, celebration assemblies and awards evenings

Attendance

Our attendance is high, well above the national average. There are systems in place to monitor attendance and punctuality and parents are kept informed. Excellent attendance and punctuality are recognised through our rewards system.

Behaviour for learning

We have high expectations of behaviour for learning in lessons, around the school and outside of school. Our behaviour policy is continually reviewed and staff follow procedures consistently so that students feel safe and classroom conditions are optimal for learning.




