Centre Assessed Grades

The school is now in the process of compiling grades for Years 11 and 13 and will be submitting these to exam boards in due course. I have attached a more detailed letter with this email which you should find helpful. There are some key points that I would like to emphasise in this letter:

- All grading will be objective and fair. The school has put in a rigorous checking process before submission which will ensure this.
- Under no circumstances will anyone in the school discuss grades with students or parents. Please do not enquire as advised by Ofqual.
- From 1st May, no A-Level, BTEC or GCSE work will be set on our online platform for Years 11 and 13.
- We will instead be introducing transition work for our Year 11 students to ready them for Post 16 study in September.
- Year 13 students should be researching their subject of study at university and begin pre reading. Students are advised to check the university’s portals.

Laptops

As you may be aware, the Government is looking to provide laptops for some students who may struggle to access online learning at home. At present, DWHS is awaiting further guidance from the Government regarding how this will be managed on a school level. We will, of course, update you as soon as we know more.
