### SPOTLIGHT ON – The London Museum of Water and Steam

Based in the historic buildings of the former Kew Bridge Waterworks, the <u>London Museum of Water & Steam</u> tells the story of London's water supply, the site, its people and the amazing pumping engines that helped to make London the great city it is today.



As well as housing the world's largest collection of stationary steam pumping engines, the Museum is also home to a narrow-gauge steam locomotive and a Waterworks Gallery that traces the development of London's clean water supply. The Museum offers a fun and educational day out for families and steam enthusiasts alike.



The heart of the museum is its collection of magnificent steam pumping engines. These comprise the Cornish engines, which are in their original engine houses, and the rotative engines, which have been collected by the museum trust from pumping stations across the country.

The museum is open every day during school holidays and Weds – Sundays term time.

**Children under 18 years old get FREE admission**, adults are £17 (cheaper if you book online), however it is worth considering becoming a member at

just £25 for the year, you get the following:

- 12 months free entry to the Museum
- A £5 voucher to redeem at the Museum shop
- Bi-monthly e-newsletters with up-todate news and member offers
- Access to exclusive member-only events

- Access, by appointment, to the Museum library and archive
- 10% discount on Museum venue hire
- Free entry to the <u>Musical Museum</u> in Brentford (located next door!)

**How to get there:** Buses - They are well served by a number of major bus routes. 65 (Ealing to Kingston, 24hour), 237 (Hounslow to White City), 267 (Fulwell to Hammersmith), 391 (Richmond to Fulham). All buses stop at Kew Bridge Station. Main Line Rail: Kew Bridge (South West Trains from Waterloo via Clapham Junction). Tube: Gunnersbury (**District Line** then 237 or 267 bus) or Kew Gardens (**District Line** then 391 bus from Sandycombe Road 2 mins walk from the station towards Kew Gardens), South Ealing (**Piccadilly Line** then 65 bus to Kew Bridge).

Baby changing facilities are available. Birdie's Cafe offers children's meals and high chairs are provided. You can also warm bottles in the café.

What's Nearby? The Musical Museum is next door. The famous Kew Gardens is within walking distance. The Watermans Arts Centre is also on the same road. And don't forget, the River Thames!


